This is an outdoor Cinema application 499 capacity. The screen to be located at the South End of Park using the China Hal Gate for public access.

The infrastructure will be build and de rigged after each screening, Portaloos to remain on site.

This is a ticketed event. Guests will be encouraged (via website and on tickets) to use public transport when travelling to the event. The films (tbc) are all 12A certificates

**Site Specific** A 50 metre square section of the park will be fenced off in order to help manage crowds and validate buying a ticket. Only guests with valid tickets will be allowed to enter the fenced off seating area

There will be a main entrance measuring 2 metres wide and emergency access on either side of the site measuring 3 metres (this access will be fenced, but will have breaks in the fencing so be can easily remove the section to allow any emergency access/exits

**Screen Information** The actual projection surface of the screen is 10x6m, but that projection surface is connected to an inflatable frame that adds height and width to the structure making it roughly 14x9m. The screen is tethered by guys and pegs from each corner and then pegged in at the base too. The pegs are then covered with one metre square signs to stop people walking into them.

Lighting When the film ends, floodlights are used to aid egress.

LED lights will also be placed in each portaloo to make it a little more pleasant when using.

**Seating** This event is not seated however VIP seating if people wish to buy a ticket that includes a chair. The chairs provided are folding directors chairs.

**PA SYSTEM** The PA system is a stereo system so there is a big stack of speakers either side of the screen. The sound is monitored throughout the screening to try to ensure it stays below 70db - 65db will be stipulated (barring spikes i.e. an action or a dance sequences)

### Discounted ticket scheme for the local community

All the houses on the roads surrounding the park will have a flyer put through their door two weeks before the screenings take place informing them what's happening and inviting them to join us for half price. They're asked to bring that flyer with them to prove that they are a local resident and get half price tickets on the door.

**Security** A professional security company will be employed (Gallowglass) to provide security guards for the cinema screenings. 4 guards are employed each evening and they start 30minutes before the doors open and finish 60minutes after the doors close. They all wear branded uniform, Pop Up Screens high visibility coats and display their SIA cards on their arms. The security staff are placed around the site: 1 at the door, 1 behind the screen and 2 float around the site. The refreshments manager, the door manager and the security staff are connected via walkie talkies and each also carries a mobile phone. The control tent will house the first aider and act as the Event/Incident Centre where all the information about the event, licenses, accident books, fire extinguishers and radio bases will be housed.

**Waste Management** Guests will be given refuse sacks for the packaging of any food or drink they consume during the screening. The bags are collected at the end of the night and conduct a thorough litter sweep. All rubbish is then either removed from site each night or when available we arrange with the local authorities for waste collection.
